Thirty-six hours in November—a unique opportunity for management scholars to develop their work for possible publication in *AMD*. During the “hackathon” participants will meet with *AMD* Associate Editors and Editorial Review Board members — several times over the weekend — to discuss, revise, and improve successive versions of their empirically-driven papers.

Those interested in participating in the workshop need to submit a *complete* paper consistent with [AMD’s mission](#) (no paper proposals, please) no later than **October 30, 2019**.

Please note that registering and submitting a paper does not guarantee acceptance to the “hackathon.”

*AMD* editor-in-chief, [Peter Bamberger](#), will choose the papers that will be invited to the “hackathon.” Any paper that would be considered for publication in *AMD* is eligible for the “hackathon”—so please make sure to follow *AMD*’s [Information for Contributors](#) before submitting a paper.

Final selections will reflect

1. The areas of expertise of *AMD* AEs and ERB members participating in the “hackathon” and
2. The likelihood that a paper can be revised in a way that will make it publishable in *AMD*.

Papers that are already under review at *AMD* (or elsewhere) cannot be submitted to the “hackathon.”

Papers that are accepted to and developed through the “hackathon” does not guarantee acceptance and publication in *AMD*. These papers will need to go through the same peer review process as any *AMD* submission. However, it is our hope that the “hackathon” experience provides attendees with substantive feedback to improve their work.
